

Background: CBMS was established in Tajikistan in 2014 with support from the US National Institutes of Health. CBMS integrates, in a culturally sensitive way, intensive didactic training in western science with strong knowledge of traditional botanical medicines. Its goal is to develop a sustainable mechanism for graduating Ph.D. and postdoctoral-level research scientists who can merge these two systems for the benefit of Tajikistan. CBMS focuses on metabolic syndrome (MetS) and diabetes providing research training with an emphasis on anti-diabetic botanicals, life cycle studies and early life determinants of chronic diseases. One of CBMS' missions is to organize annual workshops on the subject of *Plants for Human Health*.
